## SUNSHINE STATE CONFERENCE ATHLETES OF THE WEEK

### SOFTBALL



**PLAYER OF THE WEEK** -- Rollins senior first baseman **Sherri Rabenold** (Jacksonville, Fla.) led the Tars to a 4-1 weekly record, including a conference series win at Lynn. Rabenold batted .563 with eight RBI, three runs, a double, a triple, and two home runs. She hit safely in all five games and tallied multiple hits in three contests. Her most impressive outing came in the series finale at Lynn, as Rabenold went 3-for-4 with two home runs and six RBI to power the Tars to a 15-1 victory. For the week, she recorded a 1.125 slugging percentage, a .588 OBP, and a 1.000 fielding percentage.



**PITCHER OF THE WEEK** -- Barry junior **Amber Jack** (Homestead, Fla.) continues to be formidable force for the No.1 Buccaneers, tossing three complete game shutouts on the week. In 26.2 innings, Jack allowed three earned runs on 10 hits and two walks while striking out 22. She began her week with a complete no-hitter in the Bucs' 2-0 win over Palm Beach Atlantic. She also picked up a pair of SSC road wins against Florida Southern, surrendering just two hits with no walks in a 1-0 series opening victory and allowing three hits with no walks in another 1-0 win in the finale. She struck out five in both contests. Jack concluded the week with a 0.79 ERA and limited Barry's opponents to a .116 batting average.



**PITCHER OF THE WEEK** -- Nova Southeastern freshman **Lexi Sarradet** (Miami, Fla.) had a stellar week for the Sharks, picking up three complete game shutouts in four appearances. In 19.0 innings of work, Sarradet allowed just six hits and eight walks while striking out 33 batters. Beginning the week with an 8-0 win over Northwood, she scattered three hits with one walk and fanned 12. In a 10-0 SSC win versus Eckerd, she gave up only one hit with four walks and nine strikeouts. In another 10-0 win at Eckerd, she allowed two hits and three walks while striking out seven. NSU's opponents managed a meager .095 batting average when Sarradet was in the circle.

**PLAYER OF THE WEEK** -- Nova Southeastern senior first baseman **Bryan Cook** (Rockledge, Fla.) led the Sharks to a 2-2 weekly record, including a conference series win against Rollins. Cook batted .500 with eight RBI, seven runs, a double, and two home runs. He notched multiple hits in all three games versus Rollins. In a 9-6 win in the opener, he went 4-for-5 with a double and homer, driving in three runs and scoring three. In an 8-7 setback in the finale, Cook did his part by going 2-for-4 with a home run and five RBI. For the week, he recorded a .938 slugging percentage and a .529 OBP.

## SSC Golf Championships Tee off April 14-15 at Duran Golf Club

The 2008 SSC Golf Championships teed off Monday morning at Duran Golf Club in Viera, Florida.

Competition should be exciting in both the men's and women's events, as both fields feature defending NCAA Division II national champions and a slew of teams ranked in the latest Golf World rankings.

On the women's side, Florida Southern will look to defend its 2007 SSC championship. The Moccasins, currently ranked No. 2 in Division II, will look to hold off No. 1 Rollins, which reeled off a string of four straight SSC titles from 2003-2006 and finished second to FSC a year ago.

Also vying for the league crown will be No. 4 Nova Southeastern, which tied with Lynn for third place in last year's championship standings. The Fighting Knights currently rank eighth in DII. Yet another nationally-ranked team looking for the win in Viera will be No. 7 Barry, which finished fifth in last year's conference event.

Florida Tech, which placed sixth in 2007, saw Daniela Iacobelli win individual medalist honors at both the SSC and NCAA Division II championships last spring. Saint Leo, last year's seventh-place finisher, and Eckerd round out the women's field.

The men's event features four nationally-ranked teams, including last year's NCAA DII champion Barry, which currently ranks No. 11. In 2007, the Buccaneers registered a third-place finish at the SSC Championship.

No. 14 Nova Southeastern will try to defend the SSC title it claimed a year ago. The Sharks also won the league title in 2005. No. 3 Florida Southern, which tied for fifth last spring, will look to regain the championship form it held when it took five straight SSC victories from 1997-2001. Rounding out the ranked contingent is No. 13 Lynn, which tied FSC for fifth in 2007 and won the SSC crown in 2006.

Florida Tech will seek to replicate its stellar finish last year, as the Panthers took second-place in the conference championship standings. Tampa finished fourth in the event, while Rollins (7th), Saint Leo (8th), and Eckerd (9th) rounded out the ranks.

**SSC Tennis Championships to be Contested April 17-19  
at Lakeland's Beerman Tennis Center**

The 2008 SSC Men's and Women's Tennis Championships will be held April 17-19 at the Beerman Tennis Center in Lakeland.

In the women's draw, Lynn secured the top seed by posting a perfect 8-0 record in SSC play. The Fighting Knights will look to win their third straight SSC title and fourth in five years. Lynn will open play on Thursday against eighth-seed Tampa.

Rollins secured the #2 seed with a 7-1 league mark and will square off against #7 Florida Tech in quarterfinal action. Third-seed Barry, the last team besides Lynn to win the conference crown in 2005, will face #6 Saint Leo in Thursday's action. The other quarterfinal match will feature #4 Nova Southeastern and #5 Florida Southern.

The men's draw will see top-seed Barry, which tallied an unscathed 6-0 mark in conference play, receive a quarterfinal bye. The Buccaneers will look to win their first SSC championship since 2005.

Second-seeded Lynn, which posted a 5-1 conference record, will take on #7 Saint Leo in Thursday's quarterfinals. The defending national champions have won the last two SSC championships.

Third-seeded Florida Southern will open championship action against #6 Eckerd, while #4 Rollins and #5 Florida Tech will square off in the other quarterfinal tilt.

Both the women's and men's events feature a trio of teams ranked in the top 10 in the latest NCAA Division II national rankings. On the women's side, Lynn is currently ranked No. 3 in the country, while Rollins is No. 7 and Nova Southeastern is No. 9. Additionally, Barry sits at No. 14 in Division II, while Florida Southern is No. 16, and Saint Leo is No. 29.

On the men's side, No. 5 Barry leads the nationally-ranked contingent, while Lynn is No. 6, and Rollins is No. 9. Florida Southern is currently slotted No. 14 in DII, and Florida Tech is No. 41.
